Each suite has a private elevator, dining and living rooms fit for a king, and elegant touches like soap speckled with 24-carat gold flakes, unlimited Dom Perignon and twenty-four-hour private butler service. Luxury like this doesn't come cheap, though.

Base price is just under \$8,200 per night.

VACATIONING ON A converted oil rig might not be your idea of paradise, unless you are a scuba diver looking for the ultimate dive experience. The Seaventures Dive Rig is the only converted oil rig in the world to offer adventureseeking divers the chance to dive the nearby Sipadan Island. With more than 3,000 species of fish and a 600-meter wall, this protected Malaysian island consistently makes most "Best Diving in the World" lists. "Sipadan is the stuff of divers' dreams, where you see turtles, sharks, barracuda, huge schools of jacks and many more, not just fleetingly but in your face all the time," says Asia-based scuba journalist and author Chris Mitchell. "Jacques Cousteau raved about Sipadan when he first dived it [in 1989] and he was a hard man to impress." In order to protect Sipadan's fragile ecosystem, in 2004 the Malaysian government ordered all dive resorts to leave the island, banned night dives and set a limit of 120 divers per day. Guests at Seaventures Dive Rig need to book a minimum stay of three nights to guarantee one-day Sipadan permits.

The accommodations range from a bunk room to a rather comfortable family-style suite.

Dive packages including permits start at \$625 per night, per person and do not include equipment rental.





MANTA RESORT TANZANIA

WHAT BEGAN AS AN INSPIRED work of installation art in a Swedish lake has now reached the island of Pemba in the Indian Ocean. The floating glass cube makes for the most breathtaking of hotel rooms. First conceived in Sweden, the Genberg Underwater Room has been reimagined in this tropical locale.

TALK ABOUT REMOTE!

THIS HOTEL ROOM LITERALLY FLOATS IN THE MIDDLE OF THE OCEAN.

The three-story house offers a living area at sea level with a roof for sunbathing and stargazing, but the real magic happens beneath the surface in the bedroom (and not how you think). At night, spotlights illuminate the room's immediate surroundings, creating a surreal luminous view of the marine life around it. The coral reef is teeming with exotic fish, and the quiet nights attract squid and octopi—a more reclusive crowd than the daytime sea life. Guests can also choose to slumber on the roof under the stars; the Zanzibar archipelago is free of light pollution and guarantees a crystal clear blanket of stars every night.

Manta resort sits on Pemba Island off the coast of Tanzania; the less seaworthy can book a stay in one of its sixteen land-based rooms. This tiny island has a population of around 30,000, and you will never find more than a few dozen tourists.

One night in the Underwater Room is just over \$1,500 for two people.

STAR BEDS loisaba.com

SLEEPING UNDER THE STARS is not a unique idea. Sleeping in a Star Bed under the Kenyan sky with elephants and hippos as your pajamaparty companions is. Fiona Sandeman, tourism manager of Loisaba, says, "The Star Beds really are special. A guest once described it as the biggest bedroom in the world—the starry night is your ceiling! Wake up with coffee in bed and watch the sunrise over the dam."

Loisaba is in Laikipia County, Kenya, about a six-hour drive from Nairobi and miles from the nearest town. The safari experience alone is enough to draw

guests, but the Star Beds add a rare and extraordinary element.

These hand-carved beds are perched on an en-suite "platform" with halfcovered thatch roof, handcrafted furniture, and wooden floors set among big rocks, overlooking watering holes and the Ewaso N'giro River. And all meals are prepared over the fire in the traditional camp kitchen. When it's time to turn in for the night, you will be shrouded under a mosquito net so you can comfortably drift off to the lullaby of the African wilderness.

Guests are guided and hosted by a team of traditional Samburu and Laikipiak Maasai warriors, who stand guard all night to protect against any curious animal visitors.

An all-inclusive stay in the Star Beds is approximately \$400 per person, per night in high season.

Ariau Amazon Towers Hotel is one of the largest commercial tree-house hotels in the world, described by Forbes as "the world's only accommodations set amid the wildflowers, birds and monkeys of the rainforest canopy." Located on the Ariau River, a tributary of the Rio Negro near Manaus, this exotic hotel offers guests smallboat rides to local villages, where you can fish for piranha and swim with pink dolphins. Guests arrive via a two-and-a-half-hour ride down the Amazon River.


This architectural wonder features aerial towers linked by miles of wooden catwalks seventy feet up in the canopy and offers 263 guest rooms. But the room to book is the Tarzan Suite, which has a private balcony, plunge pool, living room and Jacuzzi. Celebrity guests have included Bill Gates and Prince Charles.

Amidst the treetops there are also two swimming pools and two heliports. We recommend booking at higher levels for better views.

THE OPENING LINE OF KAREN Blixen's novel Out of Africa has spawned many a safari fantasy: "I had a farm in Africa, at the foot of the Ngong Hills." Her namesake suite at Giraffe Manor is the ideal spot for families looking for a remarkable getaway.

Built in the 1930s and modeled after a Scottish hunting lodge, this luxury boutique hotel has become famous for its resident herd of Rothschild giraffe, which are the children of the original pair brought to the manor by its former owners in 1974. This is the only place in the world where you can feed and photograph a giraffe over the breakfast table, at the front door or from a bedroom window. The friendly giraffes pop up in the most unexpected places, vying for your attention and checking out what's on your plate. Relax on the veranda where you can hand feed the friendly long-necked beauties.

The manor sits on twelve acres within a 140-acre indigenous forest and has beautiful views of the Ngong Hills. In 2014 it was named Travel & Leisure's Top Family Hotel in Africa and the Middle East. Local excursions include the David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust, where guests can meet, feed and even adopt baby elephants, and the nearby Karen Blixen Museum. The metropolitan city of Nairobi is just a short eleven-mile journey.

Rates start at \$525 per night for a fullboard stay, including airport transfer.

THERE ARE TREE HOUSES, AND THERE are planes reimagined as hotels. But there's only one luxury suite fashioned out of a former 727 perched in a tree—making it the coolest tree house ever.

This 1965 Boeing jet spent its flight life shuttling globetrotters on South Africa Air and Avianca Air; now it provides adventure-seeking travelers a unique home in the jungle of Costa Rica. Don't fret, you won't be dining on tired tray tables or sleeping in seat 12B. The plane's interior is paneled with Costa Rican teak and the furnishings are hand-carved teak pieces from Java, Indonesia. The tree-house suite features two air-conditioned bedrooms with en suite baths, an ocean-view terrace, a river rockspiral staircase entrance and 360 degrees of surrounding gardens. If watching the resident sloths, toucans and monkeys gets boring, the rooms have flat-screen TVs.

The 727 Fuselage Home is offered by Hotel Costa Verde, which is situated on a rainforest bluff between Manuel Antonio National Park and the Pacific Ocean. The hotel is just 300 yards from the beach and has three cliffside buildings featuring a variety of room types.

Rates start at \$500 per night in high season for the 727, no boarding pass necessary.



THE DEEPEST HOTEL ROOM IN the world can be found 509 feet beneath the earth's surface in an old silver mine in Västmanland, Sweden. Your stay in this subterranean palace begins with a tour of the mine (accessed by elevator), which, during its heyday, produced more than three tons of silver a year. The tour ends at your underground suite, a vision in—you guessed it silver, where the wall glow and the furnishings have been hand-selected to complement the silver surroundings.

Though it's chilly in the rest of the mine, the underground suite is heated to a near-balmy 64 degrees. Guests are advised to bring warm clothes for the mine tour and late night trips to the bathroom, which is at ground level and apparently a bit frigid.

A staff member is available above ground throughout the whole night, and guests are given an intercom radio (cell phones do not work in the cave).

A night's stay is \$565 and includes tour, refreshments and breakfast.

IF YOU'RE INTO ALL THINGS MIDDLE EARTH, then a stay at The Hobbit Motel is sure to appeal. Numerous scenes in the Lord of the Rings trilogy were filmed in New Zealand's dramatic landscapes, and this lodging is a lasting tribute to the blockbuster





films. The Hobbit Motel is a string of rooms built into a hillside, which look very similar to the fantasy home of Frodo. Each unit accommodates up to six people and has a bathroom and kitchenette.

The unusual motel was built using polystyrene blocks, keeping it cool in the summer and warm in the winter. Located in Woodlyn Park, it is a former farm that now claims to be the only place in New Zealand to bring Kiwi culture alive with a history and heritage show, a kiwi bear and a dancing pig (really).

You can make a Lord of the Rings fan's dreams come true for just under \$200 per night.

IN FINNISH, THE WORD FOR THE AURORA borealis is "Revontulet," which translates to "Fox Fires." The name comes from a Finnish myth in which the lights are caused by a magical fox sweeping its tail across the snow, spraying it up into the sky. Though this resort in the Finnish Lapland offers skiing, ice fishing and reindeer-

drawn sleigh rides, the real draw is the chance to see the awesome spectacle of the northern lights.

Here, guests can bed down for a night of lights viewing in one of the glass-domed ice igloos. Though the temperatures outside might dip to negative forty, inside you'll be tucked into a sleeping bag on furs in an almost-cozy room where the temps hover around 28 degrees. For the less hardy, there are log cabins that feature glass domes so that the northern lights can be viewed in all their majesty, with toasty toes.

If seeing the lights from the relative comfort of your igloo is not thrilling enough for you, you can go "Aurora Hunting." You'll chase the northern lights in a horse- or reindeer-drawn sleigh through the crisp winter night. Aurora season lasts from late August until the end of April.

Although each pod is powered solely by the sun, wind and rain, guests still have access to modern amenities including Wi-Fi, television, and the all-important Netflix. The one-, twoand three-bedroom homes are decorated in a bohemian-chic style and offer every comfort, with zero carbon emissions.

This visionary community was named one of Lonely Planet's Top Ten Eco-Stays in the World for 2014.

Rates range from \$200 to \$400 per night, depending on the season.

IN 2011 DESIGNER PIERRE STEPHANE Dumas unveiled his line of transparent bubbles that allow people to sleep with almost nothing blocking their view of nature. His goal was to create a portable earth-friendly space that allows inhabitants to feel at one with nature, minus the bugs and humidity. Since not many can afford the \$11,000 price tag for the unusual camping tent, those keen on a see-through sleeping experience can book a night at the Attrap'Reves hotel.

The bubbles can be found in five different locales in France, including a Provençal pine forest and a field in Luberon. The stylish bubbles are all located within short walking distance from the nearest village and a main building, which provides meals, an outdoor Jacuzzi and other amenities. While most of the bubbles are completely see through, a few are semi-opaque offering guests a bit more privacy.

The bubbles are about thirteen feet in diameter, feature a queen-size bed, have separate bathroom bubbles and include telescopes with star charts.

Packages average \$120 per night.

IF BIG BIRD WERE LOOKING for a great escape, he would surely vacation in the "Human Nest" at Treebones Resort in Big Sur, California. This unusual work of woven wood-art was created and built by Big Sur artist Jayson Fann. Guests reach the rustic lodging via a wood ladder and are advised to bring a sleeping bag as there are no bed linens, though there is a futon to help get a good night's sleep in possibly the most unusual hotel room we've ever heard of.

Plush accommodations this is not. There is no turndown service and no chocolates on your pillow



(in fact there are no pillows, it's strictly BYOP). Instead there is a panoramic view of the Pacific Ocean and a once-in-a-lifetime chance to experience the world as our feathered friends do.

Treebones also offers yurts, which seem palatial by comparison. This eco resort boasts of being truly off the grid, producing its own power and growing its own food. Oh, and if you need to make a phone call, don't bother with your cell phone (there is no reception), you'll have to use the pay phone.

The nest rents for \$150 per night, with a two-night minimum and a two-person limit.
